EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Central University of Kerala (CUK) is one of the 16 Central Universities established under “The Central Universities Act, 2009 (Parliament Act No.25 of 2009)”. It came into existence on 2nd March, 2009 along with the appointment of the first Vice-Chancellor Dr. Jancy James and her assuming office on the same date. The University started functioning from a transit campus at Vidyannagar, Kasaragod, on 4th June, 2009 with the administrative support of an OSD and two academic programmes – MA in English & Comparative Literature; and MA in Economics were launched in the same year. Currently the number of Departments are grown into 22 under 11 Schools as given below.

The University underwent a significant period of transformation by now. This transition is reflected in infrastructural development as well as academic achievements. As noted first phase of constructions on the permanent campus of CUK

at Periyar, Kasaragod, was completed. The Multipurpose Hall was inaugurated on February 17, 2016 and consists of Stage and Auditorium, and few Administrative Sections and Central Library.

The construction of eight major Academic Blocks (by CPWD and RITES) are progressing at 70% for which the Foundation Stone was laid by the Hon'ble Union Minister of Law, Sri Sadananda Gowda on September 4, 2015. The University succeeded in constructing a few unifloor buildings at its permanent campus. Another achievement was that a Ladies Hostel (unifloor building) was constructed at the permanent site enabling us to accommodate 164 girl students. The hostel was occupied on 1st November 2013. Two permanent hostel buildings (Men's Hostel and Women's Hostel) with a total capacity 420 seats were inaugurated by Hon'ble Minister, Dr. Mahendra Nath Pandey on 8th October, 2016. Presently, our major focus will be to develop the full-fledged campus in Tejaswini Hills.

The CUK's mission is to extend the scope of learning through a holistic methodology that accommodates diverse linguistic, scientific and cultural traditions. The new educational policies of the Government of India urge the Universities to take cognizance of the changing needs of private enterprise in planning new courses and to seek support from industries for supporting research. The CUK is preparing to focus on better quality of research and innovation in higher education. Our expert faculty with international exposure contributes much to this goal. This multidimensional approach in designing and executing its programmes is hoped to create a paradigm shift in academics.

The Central University of Kerala is founded on the lofty vision of a 'caring wisdom' that aims at sensitizing the present and future generations to the need for enrichment of the individual, sustainable development of society, and environmental harmony. We are committed to the task of realising the objectives as enumerated in the Act by providing instructional and research facilities in all suitable and relevant branches of learning to students from all sections of the society. Inter-disciplinarity has been maintained in the academic courses and research. Innovations in modern teaching-learning process are implemented, avoiding rigidity and exclusion in extending the borders of learning and research resources. Our mission is to educate and train the manpower for the development of the country. We wish to set a new benchmark for

quality higher education which is charged with the missionary zeal to establish a world that respects the equality of genders, classes and creeds; promotes scientific thought, cherishes the dreams of inclusive development, and celebrates the balance of culture and nature.

Many of our faculty members won prestigious national and international grants and fellowships; their research and publications have won international recognition; and several of our students cleared competitive examinations like the NET, GATE, etc. 60 non-teaching staff appointments against a total of 131 staff positions were made. Notifications are being issued for filling the remaining vacant teaching and non-teaching positions. Recently, the CUK filled up the positions of Registrar and Finance Officer.

Various departments at CUK organised national and international seminars, workshops and conferences since its inception which paved the way for many intellectually stimulating discussions and brought renowned academicians and leading government officials to campus. The eminent personalities hosted by CUK include the former Prime Minister, Dr. Manmohan Singh; Sri Sadananda Gowda, former MHRD Minister and two-time MP from Thiruvananthapuram, Dr. Shashi Tharoor; Chief Minister of Kerala, Shri Oommen Chandy, the former Governor of Kerala, Shri. Nikhil Kumar; WTO Deputy Director General, Dr. Harsha Vardhana Singh, Dr. Madhavan Nair, to name a few. Amidst our academic achievements, we continued to ensure that our social responsibilities are regularly fulfilled. For instance, our Social Work and Public Health and Community Medicine Departments initiated successful awareness programmes for the local population, conducted rural health awareness camps resulting in mutual knowledge transfer and extended CUK's helping hands to the tribal hamlets of Wayanad.

The University could sign an MoUs with the Spices Board for WTO Chair, Institute of Applied Dermatology (IAD) for health-care research, and Kerala Institute of Local Administration (KILA), in the area of local administration and governance. The Mahatma Ayyankali Centre for Kerala Studies was inaugurated by the Union Minister of Social Welfare, Shri Thaawarchand Gehlot on 12.07.2016 at the Capital Centre, Trivandrum. The Central University of Kerala established the Centre for

International Cooperation in 2013. We had admitted foreign students, from countries like Spain, Afghanistan, and Nigeria, joined the CUK.

The University generated an income of Rs.55,49,724/- as Overhead Charges during the last three years. Similarly income from other source like Academic receipts, Tender fee, Photocopy charges, RTI application fee, Sale of scrap, Canteen rent, Interest on own fund and Hostel rent etc. was Rs. 3,53,69,115.

The UGC allocated a total of Rs.442.50 crores (Rs.42.75 crore for XI and Rs.399.75 crore for XII Plan) as General Development Grant since its inception. Besides Rs.5 crores for launching the Department of Education was granted by UGC. The Government of Kerala has allocated Rs.7 crores for water supply scheme, electricity and for rehabilitating the colony people residing in the midst of the Campus.

The CUK conducted the First Convocation on 18th July, 2014. Hon'ble President of India graced the occasion as the chief guest. The Chancellor of CUK, Dr. V L Chopra, chaired the function. The Hon'ble Governor of Kerala, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Kerala and many other dignitaries participated in the programme. 567 students who had passed out from the year 2011 to 2013 were awarded the degrees.

We are optimistic about the future and sensitive to the challenges ahead. Providing essential infrastructure to all teaching and research departments, administration, library, utilities like residential quarters, guest house, full-fledged library and filling up all teaching and non-teaching positions in the University are the top priorities now. Major initiatives will be taken in this regard.

Established in 2009 in northern most part of Kerala, also one among the four backward district of the state, the Central University of Kerala has tremendous responsibilities in changing the educational level scope of the country. Nevertheless, we have considerable challenges in the form of infrastructural limitations and paucity of teachers. Therefore, the most important priorities of the CUK are to provide sufficient infrastructure and complete the process of faculty recruitment. We need to build up teaching and non-teaching quarters, Guest House, Main Library, Administrative Buildings and Sports Complex. The open-air auditorium and football ground are ready for use. Internal roads are developing but also require physical amenities like water, electricity, proper sewage system.

The MHRD has also given the task to establish Community College, promote massive online open courses, introduce B.Voc. programmes, adopt five villages in the local vicinity for social and intellectual development. The younger generation are to be attracted to digital knowledge under Digital India Initiative and other knowledge enabling programmes. We are also committed to Skill India Initiative and other skill development programmes. The CUK is moving ahead to achieve fully Wi-fi enabled Campus and the work in this regard led by NICSI as PMC had started. We also need to promote academic collaboration with local industries, establish MoUs and collaborations with world-class institutes and laboratories, corporate organizations, etc.

Our admission has been made online and examination is conducted by CUCET team. Central Universities Common Entrance Test (CUCET) is an all-India test being organized by ten Central Universities together and provides a single window opportunity to the students to seek admission to about 200 programmes across ten Universities. Students from 16 states are represented in our University. The reservation of the candidates is being made as per the norms of Government of India. In addition to that, University provides additional seats for PWD, domicile of Jammu Kashmir, Kashmiri migrants, wards of defence persons. Because of the diverse socio-economic background, the University conducts an orientation programme for freshers.

The Central University of Kerala has adopted the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). The students are continuously assessed for 40 marks by class test, assignments, seminars, quiz, debates, etc. The remaining 60 marks are assessed through end semester examination.

The average time taken by the University for the declaration of end semester examination results is two weeks.

The academic programmes run by this University have been designed in a manner to pursue and promote excellence, innovation and creativity. A significant departure has been made from traditional lecture method and new ICT enabled pedagogy has been adopted. As a result of that substantial gain in learning, divergent and critical thinking has been achieved through various programmes.

The University follows a systematic process in designing and revising of existing curriculums. For inclusion of new and/or revision of courses, feedbacks are obtained from international/national faculty, students, alumni and industry. These feedbacks are discussed in Faculty Council. The Faculty Council decision is presented before the Board of Studies. The brain storming discussions in Board of Studies leads to a fine tuned syllabus. The recommendations of the Board of Studies are then approved by the Academic Council for implementation of the same. All programmes consists of a set of core courses, a set of electives (including interdisciplinary courses), internship/field visits and Dissertations/Projects.

The University has a Dean of students welfare for student support service. There is an Anti-ragging cell and no serious ragging has been reported. In addition the University have a placement cell, grievance redressal cell, equal opportunity cell, NSS, etc.

Like any other institutions that suffer from its budding stage problems, the CUK also has issues. We can certainly overcome this situation, institutionalize and provide a proper ambiance for students' education their participation in academic and extra-curricular activities. Moreover, the local population and civil society in the district have tremendous expectations about the future of the University.

The IQAC, headed by Dr. Mohamedunni Alias Musthafa, ensure the quality improvement in teaching, research, extension and administration.

We are also fortunate to have 32% of students from more than 16 states and few from foreign countries. The faculty diversity is high with 38% from eleven states. This cultural mix would provide a cosmopolitan character in the functioning of the Campus. We are confident that with proper planning and vision and the support from all the stakeholders, the Central University of Kerala can positively transform the educational landscape of North Kerala.

We are also conscious of the fact that the under development of Kasaragod and North Malabar region was mainly due to educational, health-care and infrastructural backwardness. As the only Central University in Kerala, supported by MHRD and UGC of the Government of India, we have major responsibilities to uplift the quality of education and life of people of Kerala and Kasaragod district in particular. We seek the support and blessings of all citizens in our academic and social venture.
